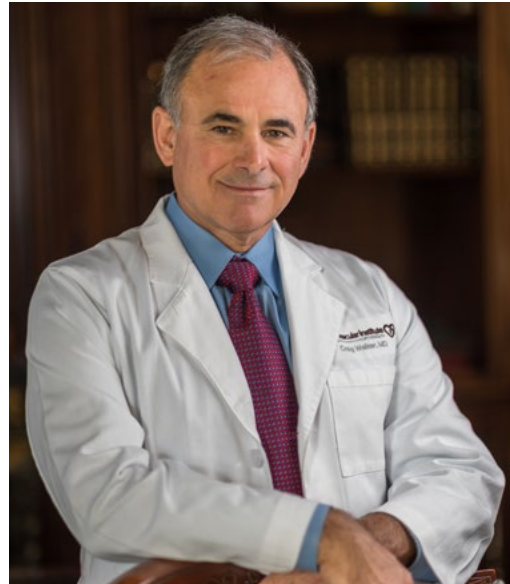

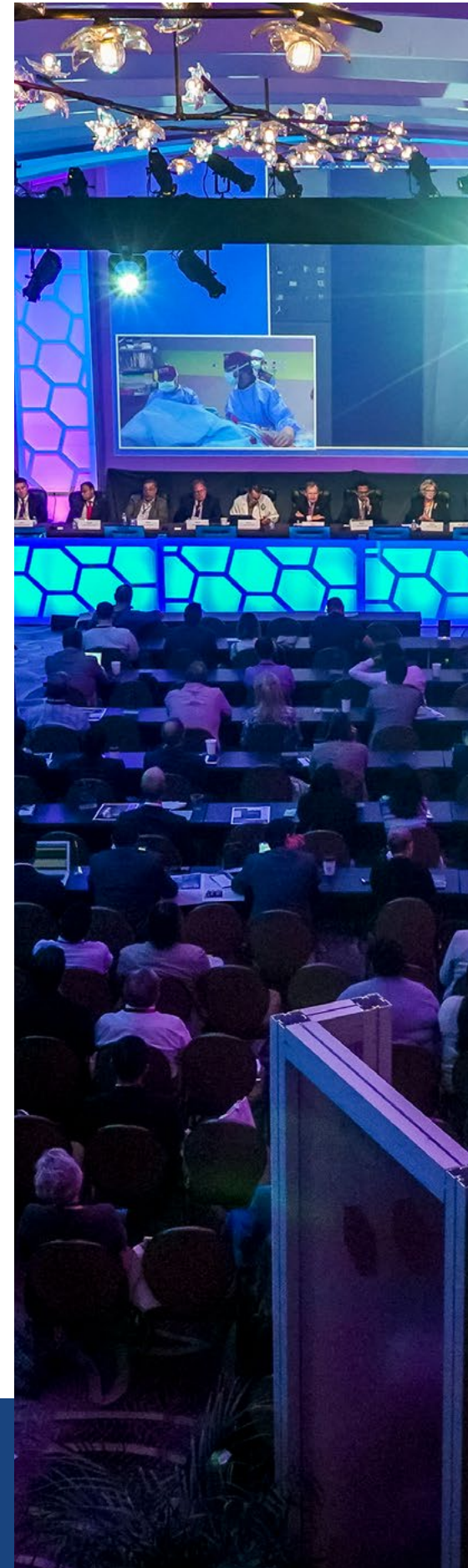


RCIS REVIEW

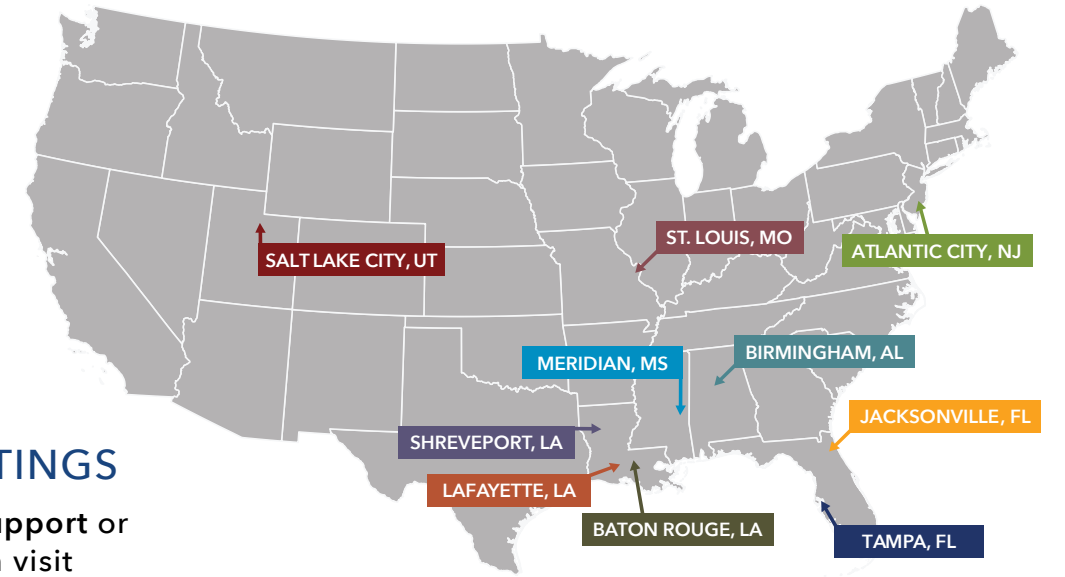
